Coverage of all expenses which might arise in connection with repatriation for medical reasons, urgent medical attention and/or emergency hospital treatment. The insurance has to cover the entire stay in the Schengen territory. Applicants who wish to apply for a six months or one year multiple entry visa are not obliged to provide a 180 (365) days coverage. Indian Diplomatic passport holders are exempted from visa requirement for Switzerland for a short stay up to 90 days. This mutual visa exemption for holders of Swiss and Indian diplomatic passport is based on a bilateral agreement.

Applications for accompanying family members (spouse and minor children) holding a normal passport, travelling along with Diplomatic passport holders can be submitted to the Embassy of Switzerland, visa section, from Monday to Thursday, between 09:00 am and 11:00 am, with a prior appointment.

Starting from 02.11.2015, all diplomatic representations of the Schengen member states in India have to capture the biometric data (finger scans) of persons applying for a Schengen visa. Therefore, personal appearance of the applicant is mandatory to submit a visa application, if the fingerprints have not been captured during the last 59 months. If the fingerprints have been captured during the last 59 months, the application can be sent through a representative.

The passport collection will be the next working day at the same time.
